Witness actual *Dead Sea Scrolls* and other early biblical artifacts to learn how transmission of these early writings has shaped the beliefs of Judaism, Christianity and Islam.

Before entering the *Dead Sea Scrolls* exhibit we'll experience the **Planetarium Show: *Secrets of the Dead Sea***, telling the story of this timeless region through its history, religion, astronomy and geology. This film brings to life the ancient stories preserved in cliffs and cave—and in the stars overhead.

### ***Ancient Artifacts Timeless Treasures***

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The ink on the 2,000-year-old parchments has faded. But for visitors at the Milwaukee Public Museum's "Dead Sea Scrolls and the Bible" exhibit, the power of the ancient writings remains.

"These words are a validation of the Bible," said one visitor.

An Israeli visitor, discovered that the Milwaukee show gave her solace that she hadn't found in her own land's museums.

Other visitors appreciated the Roman artifacts and the museum's label information about the war between the Jews and Rome that consumed the area at the time the scrolls were created.

"All this stuff is still intact and in good shape after 2,000 years. It gave me chills."

"It's amazing to think you're reading the basis of an entire religion,"

"I like the way they expanded the exhibit beyond the Old Testament to include the New Testament and other history. All the little pieces help give the bigger context behind the scrolls."

The Scrolls were discovered in a cave along the western shores of the Dead Sea by a Bedouin shepherd chasing his goats. Made up of more than 100,000 fragments written in ancient Hebrew and Aramaic, The Dead Sea Scrolls contain not only the first known biblical texts, but commentaries and community rules dating from the time of Jesus and before. Actual Dead Sea scrolls, including a fragment of the unique Copper Scroll, will be exhibited alongside the only known scroll-type manuscript of stone, the recently discovered "Gabriel Stone," and a full size reproduction of the 23- foot long Great Isaiah Scroll, one of the earliest and most complete scrolls found. During your free time at the museum you can walk through a Costa Rican rain forest and the turn-of-the-20th century streets of Old Milwaukee. A glass-enclosed tropical garden showcases butterflies and a live insect display features bugs from around the world.
